

**I. Read II Corinthians 5:10**

- A. In verse 10, the Apostle Paul clearly states that men will stand before the judgment seat of Christ. To which men does he refer?
- B. By what standard will men be judged? (read Rom. 2:12; Luke 12:47, 48)
- C. Men will be separated into two categories at the judgment seat of Christ. What are they? (read Matthew 25:31-33)
- D. Will the lost be judged *only* for their rejection of or failure to trust in Christ and His gospel? (read Hosea 6:7)

What are the implications of this for the lost?

- E. According to Scripture, is there hope of salvation in any other than Christ? (read John 3:16; 14:6; Acts 4:12; I Corinthians 3:11)

Is this fair to those who have not heard the gospel?

- F. Will there be different degrees of judgment for the lost? (read Luke 12:47, 48; Daniel 12:3; I Corinthians 3:12-14; Matthew 11:20-22; James 3:1)

For those who persistently reject Christ, remaining in their sins, where is the most dangerous place for them to be?

- G. The other group or category of men that stands before Christ's judgment seat are the saved. What will their judgment consist of? (read Revelation 20:13; I Corinthians 3:12-14)

If the redeemed are truly saved, how can they be judged?

Is it possible that the redeemed will receive punishment as the unredeemed will? (I Corinth. 3:12-15)

- H. How will the degree of reward or punishment be determined at the judgment seat of Christ? (read Matthew 25:35-45; Ecclesiastes 12:14; Luke 12:47, 48; Romans 2:16; and II Corinthians 5:10)

Will the basis for judgment be known to others? (read Daniel 7:10; Malachi 3:16; Luke 12:3; I Corinthians 4:5; Revelation 20:12)

Will others know of God's sentencing? (read Matthew 25:34-46)

Will the sentence be carried out? (read Matthew 13:30)

What will the final result of Christ's judgment be?
